## Authors instructions

### Note for the Authors

*An extended abstract is a detailed summary of the presented study. It should be sufficiently informative to let the reader autonomously grasp the main key points of the analysis, both for poster and oral presentations. The extended abstract must contain all the necessary features to let the reader understand the contents of the study, and, possibly, to cite it (introduction, methods, results, discussion and conclusion, not necessarily in different paragraphs). The extended abstract, therefore, is not just an introduction of the oral presentation nor of the poster. For instance, “In the presentation we’ll discuss about the impact of the exotic species on the riparian area and the following themes are in order...” is an example of a not sufficient explanation, as if the reader didn’t attended the presentation or didn’t view the poster, he/she would not receive enough key elements to comprehend the presented analysis and take inspiration... and therefore the BioDiv Scientific Committee may reject the submission.*

### Requested characteristics:

**Font:** Times New Roman 11 pts. Line Spacing 1.5 pts.

**File Format:** .doc o .docx

**File Name:** the abstract file shall be named according to this procedure, whether the uploaded request is related to a poster or an oral presentation:

“Surname\_Name\_Poster\_Biodiv2025.doc”

“Surname\_Name\_Presentation\_Biodiv2025.doc”

The extended abstract must contain the ordered elements, as follows:

- Author(s) (Extended Name and Surname).
- Affiliation: complete naming and city, without the address (e.g. *Department of Geoscience, Environment and Life Sciences, Università di Genova, Genova, Italy*) for each author.
- Corresponding email address.
- Title.
- Language of oral presentation/poster: Italian or English.
- Award nomination: YES / NO.
- Summary in Italian or in English (according to the language of the main text): **800 characters maximum, spaces included.**
- Main text, not divided into chapters: **minimum 4000 characters and maximum 8000 characters, spaces included.**
- Figure and/or Tables (optional): **maximum 4**; they must be numbered and cited in the text (as “Fig. N” and “Tab. N”, respectively). Caption should be short and begin with “Figure N” or “Table N”.

Images must be original (attribution can be presented in the caption), in the public domain or reproducible previa attribution (e.g. through CC Licence). The dimension of reproduced subjects must be clearly understandable or specified using a metric scale. Cartographies must contain north direction and scale as well. For drawings and graphs the requested file format is PNG or TIFF, while for photographs JPG and BMP are accepted. Image resolution shall be chosen according to print dimension (A4 format). Upload the images as separated files.

Tables shall be as simple and understandable as possible, separating lines of 1 pts must be added and the font must be Times new roman, 11 pts maximum.
- Acknowledgements (optional).
- References: 15 maximum. References and citations in text must be inserted according to British Ecological Society style (<https://editor.citationstyles.org/styleInfo/?styleId=http%3A%2F%2Fwww.zotero.org%2Fstyles%2Fjournal-of-ecology>)
